





NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. READINESS. This portion is classified - see current FORSTAT.

2. PERSONNEL/ADMINISTRATION

Personnel figures have shown a continual decline during the last six menths as indicated by a total enlisted strength of 565 in January and a present total of 482. Numbers of efficers and staff have remained comparatively stable, with most of the decline having occurred in the ranks of Sergeant and below.

- b. The figures presented do not include the redesignation of Marine Wing Weapons Unit-3 which became Sub Unit-1, H&S Battery 2nd LAAM Battalien on 1 February 1972. Further erganizational changes occurred on 29 February 1972 with the deactivation of "D" Battery. Persennel of "D" Battery were distributed among other units in the Battalien.
- c. Disciplinary actions in the previous six menths tetaled 93 NJP's, 5 SCM's, 6 SPCM's, and 1 GCM. One SPCM was appealed and an acquittal was received. Violations of Article 86 continued to predominate types of effenses and were the subject of 67 of 105 disciplinary actions. Proceedings in Administrative Discharges resulting in 10 approved (three of which were suspended) and 8 pending final action. Also, two of the three suspended are awaiting approval of vacation of suspension.
- d. Personnel Reporting showed significant improvement in accuracy and produced an average monthly error per cent rate of only 4% on an average monthly transaction of 884.

3. PERSONNEL PROGRAMS/PROCEDURES

a. The Battalien has drawn from many sources to enhance the continuing leadership development and education of personnel. The Marine Combat Crew Readiness Training Group-10 and Third Marine Aircraft Wing NCO School quotas have allowed many Sergeants and Corporals of this unit to attend NCO schools. Likewise, the 3rd MAW and MCDEC SNCO Academies have provided further training for some StaffSergeants. Since implementation the Battalion has had 17 Officers and 28 SNCO's attend the PEOPLES program. The seminar course was considered very valuable by those attending.



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- b. Two Navy Achievement Medals were awarded during the last six months and other awards included 23 Meritorious Masts. Battalien personnel were selected as 3rd MAN "Marine of the Month" during February and March and another was selected as MCAS, Yuma "Marine of the Month" for June. Twenty-two personnel were awarded Superior Performance Pay for a six month period beginning 1 January.
- c. Marines requested mast with the Battalion Commanding Officer on 47 occasions during the past six months. Action was completed on 34 of the requests and 13 were referred to higher command. The subject of requests were without trend and indicated no consistent problems.
- d. The rehabilitation of personnel claiming exemption under the Drug Exemption Program involved transfer of three personnel to the Navy Rehabilitation Center, Miramar. One Marine completed a local rehabilitation program and two others received Administrative Discharges. Since implementation six Marines have claimed exemptions and all have been discharged or have completed rehabilitation.
- e. A total of 153 Battalion personnel advanced in rank during the past six menths. One Sergeant was promoted into the ranks of SNGO while three other SNGO's advanced to higher grades. Eight of the 149 premotions to Sergeant and below were meritoriously earned.

2. PERSONNEL STATUS

- (1) At present, there is one officer, two SNCO's and one Sergeant assigned as full-time Career Planners in this unit. All the enlisted Career Planners are formal school trained with a minimum of 1 year experience in the Career Planning billet.
- (2) The addition of a second Career Planner located at the P-111 desert site has given our program greater coverage and more flexibility in both administrative and counseling contacts.

- e. On 3 March 1972 the Wing A&M Inspection was conducted. Four (4) of the five (5) Batteries inspected received a grade of SATISFACTORY. The remaining Battery received a grade of SATISFACTORY with minor discrepencies.
- f. On 9 June 1972 all personnel from A, B, and C Batteries and the Communication, WSM, and S-3 Radar Sections of H&S Battery participated in a quarterly NBC drill.

6. HAWK MAINTENANCE

Reproduced from the Unclassified / Declassified Holdings of the National Archives-

- a. Basic Electronics classes have been conducted to increase the technical ability of the personnel in the 5900 field.
- b. The establishment of the Organizational Readiness Float (ORF) has increased the scope of work to be done by this section. A reduction of the ORF has been requested due to the shortage of qualified technicians on hand.
- c. A technical inspection was conducted on the firing batteries. SATISFACTORY results were obtained.
- d. The Engineers Section rebuilt the Battalion Armory to comform with security regulations.
- e. <u>PROBLEM AREAS</u>. A definite trend in the failure of the Trans Air Conditioners was noted. Also observed were the high failure rates of the K-4 relays and input circuit breakers.

7. SUPPLY

- a. The Field Supply Analysis Team conducted an inspection of Supply Operations and Records.
- b. The Battalion Supply was relocated from Building 332 tooviding Building 480 curity and control.
- c. The Battalien Armory was relocated to Building 480 providing increased security and control.

- d. An authorization of \$66,000.00 was received and used to procure approximately 9,500 line items of MSL deficiencies.
- e. Redistribution of "D" Battery's assets began in accordance with instructions contained in redistribution messages from the Wing Supply Officer.

8. FINANCIAL

- a. During the past fiscal year the Battalion received a total grant of \$230,468.00 for stock fund account spending of which \$223,000.00 has been spent. The Battalion has further spent an additional \$67,000.00 totaling approximately 5,000 MSL requisitions during this current fiscal year.
- b. During the 3rd Quarter of this fiscal year we received 4 grants totaling \$85,560.00. In the 4th Quarter we received only one grant for the amount of \$44,440.00.
- 9. MOTOR TRANSPORT. During the period 1 January thru 30 June 1972 the Motor Transport Section travelled a total of 221,947 miles of which 24,106 was chargeable as on base mileage, and 197,841 chargeable as off base mileage. Passengers carried amounted to 22,754 with 972 Tens, 585 lbs of cargo being moved.

10. EMBARKATION

- a. The Battalion displayed its embarkation readiness in the thorough planning and swift execution of the scalift in support of Battalion FIREX 1-72 at San Clemente Island, California. Much embarkation experience was gained through this exercise.
- b. During the month of June an embarkation syllabus was instituted to introduce MEDS to all Battalion embarkation personnel. This syllabus will continue through July and August and will then allow for the implementation of the MEDS at the battery level.


