### PART II

#### NARRITIVE SUMMARY

During the major portion of this reporting period the Battalion split between the Battalion (-), commanded by Major Sollberger and consisting of H&S, Alpha, and Bravo Batteries, located at MCB Twentynine Palms, California, and Detachment Alpha, Major Spivey, OIC, consisting of Sub-unit #1, H&S Battery, and Charlie and Delta Batteries, located at MCAS, Yuma, Arizona.


From January to April, as well as conducting normal training operations, the Battalion (-) was in the process of readyingiitselft to move to Yuma, Arizona, and consolidate with Detachment Alpha, just as Detachment Alpha was busy preparing to receive the Battalion (-). The diffuculties attendant to such a move, by virtue of the large amount of personnel and equipment, not to mention the inconvience to the inindividual Marines and their families, made it necessary for the personnel to put forth their best efforts to insure proper planning and preparation was made. While conducting "business as usual", other tasks presented themselves, such as the Battalion's support of the Bob Hope Desert Classic Golf Tournament at Palm Springs, California in Feburary.

Meanwhile Detachment Alpha prepared for the Wing A & M Inspection which was held in January. During Feburary the Detachment deployed to a firing site near Tacna, Arizona, and conducted a highly successful FIREX, demonstrating their ability to perform the assigned mission of a HAWK unit. This training was augmented by weekly Anti-Air Warfare Exercises conducted at the Anti-Air Warfare Desert Training Site.

The Desert Site, recently constructed to accomodate training by MACS-1 and the Battalion, drew several important visitors, culmanating with a visit by the Commandant of the Marine Corps in March and by the Assistant Commandant in April.

The first of April found the 2nd LAAM Battalion consolidated at MCAS, Yuma, Arizona, and learning to work well as one coherent unit, conducting normal traiming operations. Major Spivey became the Executive Officer until Major Wold returned from attending the HAWK Officer's Qualification Course at Ft. Bliss, Texas. Before and since it's consolidation, the Battalion has been plagued by a shortage of enlisted personnel, and the reversion of several key temporary officers impaired the training early in the year. By May, although still undermanned, the Battalion was begining to "flesh out" and operations became somewhat easier; the shortage of drivers was lessened and Batteries were assigned their own communications personnel.

The remainder of the period was spent in continued improvement in training and operations, and saw the continued deployment of the Batteries in training exercises. The Battalion Continued to gain confidence in its ability as a unit to performe its assigned mission. At the end of June a Change of Command Ceremony and Parade was held as Major Sollberger was transferred to WesPac and Legutenant Colonel Foster assumed command.




