NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of July 1970 the Redeye LADS Tests at Yuma Proving Grounds was completed and termed a complete success. Both the 1st and 3rd Redeye Platoons returned to MCB 29 Palms, California without incident. On 31 July 1970 Captain T. R. SHINE relieved Captain F. H. ROBERTS as H&S Battery Commanding Officer and Captain ROBERTS was released from active duty. 1st Lieutenant G. S. BUCKLIN then assumed command of *A* Battery on 1 August 1970, vice Captain B. S. BOFENKAMP relieved, and Captain BOEENKAMP was subsequently transferred to WesPac. Detachment *A* meanwhile joined several new officers: 2nd Lieutenant E. L. SIMMONS, 2nd Lieutenant D. A. BRAY, 1st Lieutenant J. M. ROMICK and CWO-3 R. D. MILLER. CWO-2 W. F. GREEN of Detachment "A" was retired at Yuma on 31 July 1970, and in an awards ceremony held at a later date Gunnery Sergeant M. R. PICARILLO of Detachment "A" was presented the Navy Achievement Medal with Combat "V" for meritorious service in Vietnam. In an effort to enhance the training and administration of the Redeye Platoons, the 3rd Redeye Platoon was transferred from MAN Battery to *B* Battery and the two Platoons were set-up as a sub unit of *B* Battery. WSM held a technical inspection on Batteries *C" and *D at

Yuma and reportedly the results were quite good.

During August, H&S Battery, MA" Battery, and MB" Battery was committedto supporting MARMTD in the execution of 4thLAAM Battalion's ATD at both Camp Pendleton and MCB 29 Palms, Shortly thereafter "A" Battery was tasked to send a Battery Control Central and three (3) technicians to MACS-3 at Santa Anaa to participate in an MTDS acceptance test. "G" Battery hosted a presentation and tour of the Battalion area for members of 1st Battalion 23rd Marines, a Reserve unit from Houston, Texas. On 1 August 1970 1st Lieutenant K. E. ROWE relieved 2nd Lieutenant F. C. THOMAS as Platoon Commander of the 3rd Redeye Platoon and 2nd Lieutenant THOMAS departed for the HAWK Officer's Qualification Course at Fort Bliss, Texas. Under 1st Lieutenant ROWE's leadership twentysix (26) Redeye gunners and communication personnel then deployed to Camp Pendleton to participate in operation "HIGH DESERT" Perhaps the most significant event during the month of August 1970 was the Battalion's I. G. inspection which commenced on 31 August 1970. A vigorous program of supply inventory, re-warehousing and embarkation was conducted just prior to the I. G. Captain C. C. DURAZO relieved 1st Lieutenant F. D. SETH as Battalion Supply Officer on 3 August 1970, and 1st Lieutenant F. J. FALGOUT, the Battalion Motor Transport Officer was transferred on 27 August 1970. 2nd Lieutenant G. W. BEALS, and Captain S. E. STOTE were joined at Detachment *A* during this month and Sergeant H. M. KIRKLAND received the Navy Commendation Medal with Combat "V". Also at Detachment "A" 1st Lieutenant J. M. ROMICK was released from active duty.

Immediately following the I. G. inspection the remainder of the month of September 1970 found everyone busily preparing for the Battalion FIREX to be conducted in October 1970. "B" Battery deployed to Capehart Ridge for Operational training and the Battalion participated in a Base Parade held in honor of the Commandant of the Marine Corps. 1st Sergeant S. H. PIERCE relieved 1st Sergeant J. W. TURNER as H&S Battery First Sergeant and WO-1 A. J. SOUTHARD, Maintenance Officer of "A" Battery was transferred to WesPac. 2nd Lieutenant J. B. DOWLING reported aboard and was assigned as Platoon Commander of the 1st Redeye Platoon. Redeye continued their requalification program by requalifying ten (10) Redeye gunners at MCB. Detachment "A" concluded their phase of the I. G. and commenced preparing for the October FIREX. 1st Lieutenant G. A. DOORE of Detachment "A" was released from active duty and 2nd Lieutenant G. S. GRELECKI reported-in from HAWK school at Fort Bliss.

On 1 October 1970 the entire Battalion deployed to Colfred Airstrip, TACNA, Arizona for its annual FIREX. The Battalion was supported by MACS-1, MACS-7, and VC-3. Extensive training was realized utilizing both the manual and automatic modes of operation. Once the Battalion's missiles were successfully expended, the unit returned to MCAS Yuma and MCB 29 Palms. Support provided the Battalion was considered excellent. Upon arriving back at MCB 29 Falms, the yearly FSAO inspection was held and Brigadier General BROWN and Colonel SHIELDS visited the Battalion at both MCB and MCAS Yuma. Brigadier General BROWN is currently the Assistant Wing Commander of the 3rd MAW. At Detachment "A" 1st Lieutenant R. L. SANFORD was released from active duty and 2nd Lieutenant G. B. GABLE joined. "B" Battery provided a static display of HAWK equipment, plus a Redeye display at MCAS El Toro as part of a special instructional project. Redeye further conducted .50 caliber machine gun training at MCB.

Batteries "C" and "D" deployed on two (2) separate occasions for an AAWEX and were visited at the Desert Site by Colonel J. W. DRURY. The Re-location and organization of units at MCB 29 Palms, continued satisfactorily, and plans were finalized for transferring the Redeye Platoons to MCAS El Toro

WALZ re-assigned as H&S Battery Commanding Officer. 1st Lieutenant R. E. GRIMM relieved 1st Lieutenant G. S. BUCKLIN as Commanding Officer of MAN Battery, as 1st Lieutenant BUCKLIN is scheduled for transfer to WesPac. 2nd Lieutenants W. D. SUTTON, W. C. SCHILD, T. G. FOX and P. J. GIACINITI were joined. WO-3 R. A. DESJARLAIS relieved Captain C. C. DURAZO as Battalion Supply Officer and Captain DURAZO was re-assigned as the Battalion S-4. At MCB 29 Palms, Major L. A. SOLLBERGER personally conducted a safety lecture at each of the Batteries and at Detachment MAN. The Arizona State Highway Patrol deligered the Holiday Safety address. The Holiday Leave period commenced on 18 December 1970.

Ref: (a) Operation Order 6-70

1. SUPPLY

a. General.

- (1) All classes of supplies required are available in sufficient amounts from Battery sources.
- (2) Batteries will be responsible for procurement, movement, storage and distribution of all classes of supplies.

b. Supplies and Equipment Available.

- (1) "A" Rations 5 days for Sub Unit #1, Batteries C and D and supporting personnel.
- (2) "C" Rations will be required for all meals in the field prior to the evening meal on 16 November 1970.
 - (3) Water 5 gallons per individual per day. Batteries will carry one M-107 water trailer to utilize as the battery water supply point, the mess section will carry two M-107. A water tanker will resupply the M-107 s as required.
- (4) Only water transported by the water tanker or water tailer
 - (5) T/E items as required to accomplish mission.
 - (6) All vehicles will have full fuel tanks and five gallon gas cans prior to motor convoy.
 - (7) Required lubricants will be drawn from the Motor Transport section of supplies recommend to the section of supplies re
 - (8) Two M-49 refuelers, one diesel and one gasoline, will be on scall through the Motor Transport section to Bettery Commander for refueling requirements.

c. Control and Distribution.

- (1) Normal throughout the exercise for all classes of supplies.
- (2) Location of supply dumps and storage area as designated by Battery Commanders and Camp Commandant.

d. Resupply.

- (1) All resupply will be the responsibility of Battery Commanders and coordinated through the S-4.
- (2) Resupply to Battery Commanders will be on a call, as required basis.
- (3) "A" Rations will be procured from MCAS, Yuma.
- (4) Water point will be at Tacna, Arizona.
- (5) Resupply of POL will be procured from MCAS, Yuma,

2. EVACUATION AND HOSPITALIZATION

a. Evacuation.

(1) All casualties requiring evacuation to MCAS will be evacuated by the most expeditious means. The ambulance will be attached throughout the exercise and located at the Motor Transport section, emergency helicopter evacuation will be available through MCAS, Yuma, Arizona. Emergency evacuation request will be transmitted by field communications to Detachment Alpha (resolution of the Day, who will notify Station Search and Rescue Extension 2176, where a helicopter will be dispatched.

b. Hospitalization.

- (1) The dispensary located at MCAS, Yuma will serve as an emergency medical facility.
- (2) One Corpsman will be attached to each Battery, and will carry Unit one bags.

3. TRANSPORTATION

- a. Battery Commanders/Section Heads; make transportation request to the S-4 by 10 November 1970.
- b. Available transportation will be divided and allocated to batteries prior to displacement to the field. Battery Commanders/Section Hea will be responsible for moving their respective equipment to the field. Trucks will be unloaded and returned to the S-4 section aft movement to the field. Prior to the return to P111 desert site trucks will be made available to the batteries.


- (3) Prior to each meal, medical personnel will inspect the galley and mess facilities and report any discrepancies to the Camp Commandant.






