2. Casualties

a. Private First Class James L. EISENHART went berserk on 31 May at Battery B and injured three Marines. lst Lieutenant Patrick H. MORTON and Staff Sergeant Flor P. CASTANNDA were wounded by a grenade threwn by BISCHART and Sergeant Wilfredo TOROCOLLADO was shot with an M-14. All non were hospitalized and reported in satisfactory condition.

3. Morale/Welfare

- a. The 2d Light Anti Aircraft Missile Battalien softball team went the MAG-12 softball tournament, but lost to a MAG-12 All Star Team.
- b. 193-4 constructed a new galley and showers for Battery A on 8 May 1966; jeb completed on 16 May 1966.
- c. Was Battery galley was completed on 10 May 1966 and is now in full operation.

4. Logistics

a. 2d Light Anti Aircraft Missile Battalien commenced leading LST 692 with missiles scheduled for return to COMMS; completed leading at 1130 on 10 May 1966.

5. Maintenance

a. The Hawk Maintenance Butler Building was completed and was ecompied by the Maintenance Plateon on 31 May 1966.

6. Civil Affairs

- a. Regular Medical Civil Affairs Program visits have been continued.
- b. This unit has continued to receive clothing and some from individuals and organizations in the United States for distribution in the Civil Affairs Program.
- c. On 27 May the Commanding Officer, 2d Light Anti Aircraft Missile Battalian accompanied by the Battalian Civil Affairs Team, journeyed to the village of Ly Tin. The purpose of this visit was to distribute, at Vietnamese, much needed farm tools and equipment which had been sent by persons and community organizations in the United States.

7. Ground Defense

- a. Alpha Company, 1st Battalian, 5th Marines replaced India Company 1st Marines for perimeter guard at Battery A site (18 May 1966).
- b. Two mon from Headquartors Battalien Communications Company, 1st Marine Division, at approximately 1730 on 24 May, set up an AN/TPQ-7 in HAS Battery area and remained until 29 May.

8. Meter Transport

- a. (4-10 May) 2d Light Anti Aircraft Missile Battalien previded a total of 53 vehicles in support of other units, these vehicles traveled a total of 3,408 miles.
- b. (11-13 May) twenty M-36 trucks of this battalien were used to haul 75 leads of laterite soil to Battery C and HAS Battery. The soil was used to improve and construct the internal read networks of these sites.
- c. (11-May) 22 trucks of the battalien were utilized to move amnumition from Quang Mgai; all returned safely.
- d. (15-May) 30 trucks from this battalien, with shetgun riders, were dispatched to let Battalien 5th Marines to move troops. Trucks departed at 0630 and returned at 1300.
- e. (11-17 May) 2d Light Anti Aircraft Missile Battalion Motor Transport Section supplied a total of 56 vehicles in support of 1st Marine Division; 2,438 miles were traveled.
- f. (18-24 May) 2d Light Anti Aircraft Missile Battalien provided a total of three vehicles traveling a total of 89 miles. These vehicles were used in support of the Chu Lai Combat Base.

9. Supply

- a. Another building was added to the Battalien Supply Office in T-shape form, providing adequate working areas for all personnel. The entire reof was covered with tin, providing more protection for valuable records.
