

1. Personnel.

a. On 14 December 1967, Capt W.L. DANIEL, 093056 was promoted to his present rank.

2. Civil Affairs.

a. An Binh elementary school is now completed. The village chief has acquired another school teacher for the hamlet making a total of two. The educational level existing in An Binh will improve with the acquisition of a new school and another teacher.

b. The pig pen at Hoa My has been doubled in size. The increased area will make for better exercise and allow procreation of pigs.

c. The Civic Action Section has acquired two additional men. These men have been assigned quarters at Hill 12. Their closer contact with the Vietnamese will improve the Civic Action Program.

d. The Civic Action Team provided toys, candy, and miscellaneous gifts for more than 700 children on Christmas Eve and Christmas day. One group of 250 children and 8 adults was brought to H&S Battery for a party, while another group of 250 children and 10 adults were treated at Battery A.

e. The Civic Action Team distributed 196 cases of canned milk to the hamlets of Ky Hoa Village.

f. A total of 1345 Vietnamese of Ky Hoa Village were treated by the Battalion MEDCAP Team during the month of December.

3. Motor Transportation. A total of 4385 miles were driven in support of the Chu Lai Combat Base.
