2. Civil Affairs.

a. Approximately 110 children were transported from Ky Hoa Village to H&S Battery site for an American style picnic. Refreshments were served to the children and candy and gifts distributed.

b. Progress on An Binh Elementary School continues at a rapid pace. Material has been donated in sufficient quantity to complete about 75% of the project. This is a self-help project and, therefore, the citizens of An Binh Hamlet are providing labor.

c. The dispensary at Hoa Long Hamlet was dedicated on 27 October 1967. Numerous military and Vietnamese civilian officials were present. Beds, end tables, benches, lockers and enough medicine for initial operation were donated to the dispensary by this battalion. A Vietnamese nurse will be on duty around the clock. Ky Hoa Villagers appeared to be very proud of their new dispensary.

d. The battalion bulldozer repaired roads that were washed out during recent rains. This will be a continuing project during the monsoon season.

e. The battalion CA Team continues to conduct English classes on a weekly basis. Response continues to be excellent.

3. Motor Transportation. A total of 8015 miles were driven in support of Chu Lai Combat Base.
