
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- l. During July the Battalion completed disposition on a majority of the Basic HAWK equipment on hand, while receiving two more Improved HAWK Battery sets. New Equipment Training, (NET) continued throughout the month for a nucleus of operations personnel. Several changes of command were effected during the month with 1st Lt. R. W. CORNISH relieving Capt. J. P. TUCKER as CO of "B" Battery, and 1st Lt. C. N. BLAIR relieving Capt. C. W. CLARK as CO of "C" Battery. One field exercise was conducted which saw the Motor Transport Platoon deploy to Mount Laguna for tactical driving training and small unit tactics training.
- 2. During August the Battalion completed the initial NET and commenced supplemental NET for the remainder of the Battalion's 7200's. Detailed planning for the October FIREX, Operation STREAKER II, commenced with a joint S-3/S-4 Staff visit to Luke AFB, after which embarkation planning was initiated. Final approval for use of Gila Bend Range #1 was also received this month. Visitors included the ACMC, LtGen. JASKILKA. Changes of command were effected twice in "A" Battery where 1st Lt. S. P. CLYMER relieved 1st Lt. F. D. MOELLER, who was released from active duty, in order to provide continuity while awaiting the arrival of Capt. M. E. O'MALLEY. Capt. O'MALLEY relieved Lt. CLYMER. Battalion supply achieved the long awaited goal of loading the Battalion's Supply Account into SASSY.
- 3. During September, STREAKER II planning accelerated while supplemental NET continued throughout the month. The Communications Platoon was active, participating in two COMMEX's, one for unit training conducted at the MCAS, Yuma Rifle Range area, and one for a communications reliability check for STREAKER II, conducted at Gila Bend Range #1. The Supply Platoon continued to be busy consolidating Firing and HKS Battery supplies to Battalion control.
- 4. During October Operation STREAKER II highlighted the month, proving the versatility and accuracy of the Improved HAWK system. This initial acceptance shoot was conducted by Batteries "A" and "G" under MBDL control from the AACC. The Battalion deployed a significant portion of its Engineer, Motor Transport, Supply, Communications and HAWK Maintenance platoons to support the operation. Supplemental NET terminated just prior to the shoot, qualifying all on hand 7200's on the Improved HAWK system. The Battalions IH systems were officially accepted from Raytheon Corporation at the same time. After the FIREX the Battalion turned to final preparations for the Wing A&M Inspection.
- 5. During November the Battalion received "Satisfactory" results



during the Wing A&M Inspection and commenced HST Training with the aid of 1st Shore Party Bn. for the helicopter lift of "A" Battery for Operation DUSTY I, to be conducted in December.

6. During December, Operation DUSTY I was conducted providing the first helicopter lift of a Marine Improved HAWK Battery. Lessons learned from this operation were immediately incorporated into planning for a two Battery lift in January, Operation DUSTY II. Disposition was received on the rest of the Basic HAWK equipment by the Battalion. Change of Command occured at "B" Battery with lst Lt. D. A. RICHARDSON relieving 1st Lt. R. W. CORNISH, and the Battalion achieved "Satisfactory" results during a Wing Embarkation Inspection.

- (5) Battery Commanders will provide the personnel and equipment necessary to conduct a full scale, low level, high speed, ECM, automatic mode AAWEX operations during the period 0800, 7 December 1970 thru 1830, 11 December 1970.
