- 2. Sequential Listing of Significant Events, Especially as They Relate To:
- a. <u>Personnel</u>. One officer transferred in and one officer was transferred out of the unit. Eight Marines were awarded the Organizational Marine Corps Reserve Medal.
- b. Administration. The Detachment Administrative section has effectively maintained the unit's records, basic correspondence, SRB audits, and reports during the period.
 - c. Intelligence. Negative Report.

d. Training

(1) During the course of the 12 months covered by this report, priority has continued to be placed on maintaining qualification and expertise of Redeye Gunners. In excess of 120 hours have been devoted to Redeye training. This training has consisted of aircraft recognition, tracking head training, map reading, communications and associated military training. The unit achieved a 93.3% completion rate for MCI courses, with a 98% passing rate on the PFT.

(2) Unit training accomplished during ATD is as follows:

- (a) During 13-26 July 1980 the unit participated in RESPHIBLEX 1-80 at MCAS(H) New River. The unit conducted Redeye training as well as training in Rifle/Pistol FAM, Rappelling, CBR and gas mask/chamber. The unit then participated as aggressor forces in the RESPHIBLEX. One officer and 17 enlisted participated in the training.
- (b) During 20 Jul 2 Aug 1980 the unit assigned 1 officer and 12 enlisted to the Redeye school, Fort Bliss, TX.
- (c) During 3-16 Aug 1980, 3 officers and 19 enlisted participated in a variety of training at MCAS Cherry Point. Training highlights include Redeye Launch Simulator Training (RELS) VS. Helo, B-Mod Rifle range, Tracking Head Training, A/C recognition, HAWK integration in AAW operations, CBR/Gas chamber and administration OJT.
- (d) During 10-24 Sep 1980, 1 officer and 17 enlisted participated in exercise TEAMWORK-80 in Norway. The unit was integrated into RLT-2 missions with participation and training in all aspects of the amphibious operations. Training was primarily of an operational/OJT emphasis with eight days devoted to full time operations. Special night operations and infiltration with LFRG-4 during pre-invasion operations highlighted unit participation .

e. Special Operations

- (1) Oct 6-7 unit deployed to Dahlonega, GA. Training consisted of small unit tactics, mapping/land navigation, communications, and anti-air tactics (Fixed Wing VMO-4).
- (2) During 5-7 Dec selected members of the unit deployed to Camp Lejeune, NC, for live FIREX. 2 officers and 33 enlisted participated in the FIREX. There were 28 live launches with 26 kills. Highlights of the deployment include CBR training and 2 live launches by Marines in complete CBR protective equipment.
