NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During this reporting period, the Second Light AA Missile Battalion further developed and improved what was already a highly operational and extremely versatile unit. The following is a narrative summary by month, covering all significant events that have occurred during the past six (6) months.

The battalion had two (2) batteries in the field during July on separate exercises. Battery "A" was involved in tracking and ECM exercises with Battery "D" Detachment Alpha supporting Operation "Beagle Baron" at Chocolate Mountain. The battalion Commander, Major H. J. BALDWIN, attended a CG, MCB briefing for General L. G. WALT during the latter part of the month.

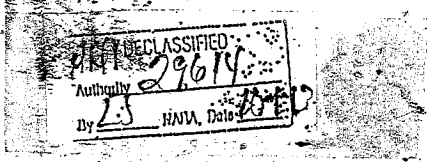
During the month of August, 2nd LAAM Bn provided technical assistance to 4th LAAM Bn. This reserve unit held a training exercise at MCB, Twentynine Palms, California, from 7-15 Aug69. 1st and 3rd Redeye Platoons participated in MACS-24's air control exercise during the first part of August 1969. Bogey information was passed to Redeye Headquarters who in turn passed it on to the teams in the forward positions. A display of Hawk Missiles and associated equipment was provided by 2nd LAAM Bn for Youth Activities Week Carnival at MCB, Twentynine Palms, from 19-22 Aug69. Toward the end of August, Battery "C" Detachment Alpha participated in training exercises conducted at Niland, California. The battery was able to successfully accomplish the objectives of antiair defense against hostile aircraft.

During the month of September the battalion had two (2) batteries in the field. Battery "A" participated in Operation "Bell Express" from 18 to 23 September. The exercise provided excellent training for the operators in tracking and locking onto aircraft in various attitudes and using ECM. Battery "B" deployed to Capehart Ridge, MCB Twentynine Palms, for an indefinite period of operational training. Toward the end of the month both 1st and 3rd Redeye Platoons held a field exercise at the X-ray area, MCB Twentynine Palms, involving site selection, preparation and tracking. The remainder of the month was spent in preparation for the Group A&M and Wing A&M inspections to be conducted in October and November.

The battalion had two (2) batteries in the field during the month October. Battery "B" was deployed to Capehart Ridge, MCB Twentynine Palms, for operational training from 22 September to 9 October. Battery "D" Detachment Alpha, deployed to Blaisdell, Arizona for Air Defense Operations Training. During the first part of October the 1st and 3rd Redeye Platoons held engagement exercises at MCB Twentynine Palms, in which live aircraft were provided by 3rd MAW.

Detachment Alpha was given a General (A&M) Inspection by 3rd MAW on 13-17 October. Detachment Alpha spent the remainder of the month correcting known discrepancies. During the month of October preparations were begun

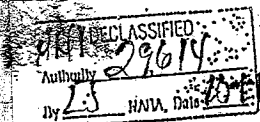


for a battalion PRE-FIREX CPX and FIREX scheduled for the latter part of November and first part of December.

During the month of November, the battalion was in final preparation for the battalion Hawk FIREX to be conducted from 1-5 December. All units taking part in the FIREX moved into Hawk Site #1 during the latter part of the month. On 8-9 November, the Redeye Platoons provided several personnel for a static display at Point Mague Space Fair. Redeye and Battery "B" both provided personnel and equipment for the Santa Ana Parade on 9 November 1969. During November, 2nd LAAM Bn at Twentynine Palms was given their General (A&M) Inspection by 3rd MAW.

During the first few days of December, the entire battalion participated in the battalion FIREX at Hawk Site #1, MCB Twentynine Palms, California. The FIREX was considered highly successful with all firing batteries firing their allotted number of missiles with a high kill ratio. On the second day of the "Shoot", the FIREX Site was visited by Major General R. G. OWENS JR, Commanding General, 3rd MAW. The general spent approximately four (4) hours at the site. For the first part of December fourteen (14) persons from the 1st and 3rd Redeye Platoon participated in BLT PHIBLEX 4-69 at Camp Pendleton. This was an amphibious operation in which Redeye elements operated with both ground and air units.

13-17 October 1969. Detachment Alpha was given a General (A&M) Inspection by 3rd MAW.

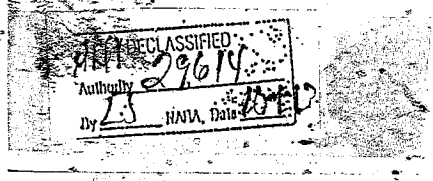
27-31 October 1969. Battery "D" Detachment Alpha, deployed to Blaisdell, Arizona.

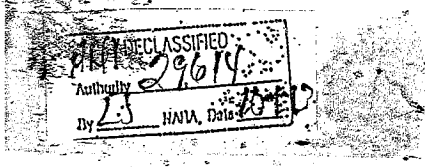
PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Fifteen enlisted and one officer from 3rd Redeye Platoon participated in operation "Beagle Baron" during the period 21-25 July 1969. The Redeye control headquarters operated from the DASC in "C" area MCB, Twentynine Palms which was supplied by MASS-5. The five teams were deployed around the live-drop zone and tracked all available aircraft.

During the period, 12-13 August 1969, one Redeye section (+) worked with MACS-24 in the x-Ray area of MCB, Twentynine Palms. This was a part of the 4th Marine Aircraft Wing Reserve training operation. Quite satisfactory results were obtained from being tied into an Air Control Squadron.

1st and 3rd Redeye Platoons held a ~~three~~ day exercise from 22-23 September 1969 at MCB, Twentynine Palms. The primary objective was that of site selection and preparation. The platoons were also able to track live aircraft which were in the area supporting the Redeye School.

From 27 October 1969 to 30 October 1969 the Redeye Platoons provided a 25 man working party to police the debris of a downed Marine Corps A-4 trainer which crashed near the Joshua Tree National Monument.

In November 1969 the platoons provided two separate demonstration teams. One two-man team went to Point Mugu Naval Air Station on 8 and 9 November for the annual Space Fair. The other team went to Santa Ana, California as part of a military display in the Veteran's Day Parade on 9 November 1969.

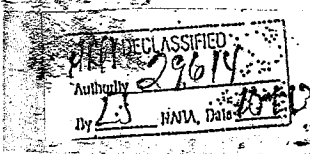
One Redeye section plus a Headquarters section deployed to Camp Pendleton for participation in BLT PHIBLEX 4-69 from 1 December 1969 to 5 December 1969. The Headquarters section went with the DASC and the gunners deployed with the infantry companies.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During this reporting period Battery D, Detachment Alpha participated in Operation Beagle Barron with COMFIRSTFLT. Battery C participated in Operation Beef Master with COMFIRSTFLT. In the two exercises, the Automatic Data Link between Niland, California and MACS-1 was accomplished through the use of the AN/TRC-97 network. This network proved to be the most reliable system in passing target information with in the automatic system because of the distance between the deployed Batteries and MACS-1. The use of the AN/TRC-97 system gave us an excellent opportunity to train officers in the MOS field 6700.

Battery D held a Battery size infantry problem at Niland, California.

The Third Marine Air Wing conducted an A & M inspection. The Marine Air Control Group 38 conducted a Pre A & M inspection.

Battery D deployed to Elaisdell, Arizona, and established a Automatic Data Link with MACS-1 for training and systems check out.

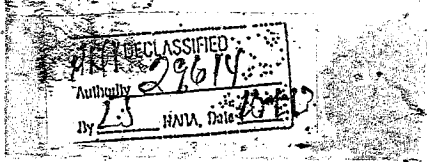
During this period one officer was promoted to captain.

The Detachment deployed to Marine Corps Base Twentynine Palms, California for Battalion FIREX which was a success. Three missiles were fired fully automatic and one fired in the manual mode. The full automated air defense system capability gave us an opportunity to train SMD's both in an automatic environment and review of manual operations in addition to contributing to a highly successful FIREX.

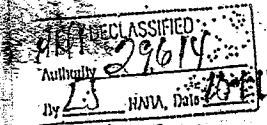
