Subj: Letter of Instruction for the Deployment of C Battery
to MCB Twenty Nine Palms, Calif.

1. Purpose. This letter provides instructions for the operational deployment of C Battery to MCB Twenty Nine Palms, Calif to participate in Desert Exercise ALKALI CANYON.

2. Training Objectives. The following general training objectives apply to this deployment:

a. To exercise current Anti Air Warfare command communications and control techniques within a LAAM Battery operating in a desert environment.

b. To evaluate the validity of current Battalion contingency planning by independently deploying a Battery(+).

c. To train and familiarize Battery personnel in independent and MACS supported unit operation, and operations in an ECM/ECCM environment.

3. Action. The following coordinating instructions will remain in effect for the duration of the operation.

a. Personnel and Administration

(1) Billeting and Messing. Billeting and messing support for all C Battery personnel will be available in a field environment.

(2) Medical. One USN Corpsman will accompany C Battery to conduct unit sickcall. Support beyond unit sickcall level will be available from MCB Twenty Nine Palms.

(3) Mail. Incoming mail will be sent on the logistics run or at least every other day. Outgoing mail will be delivered through the MCB Twenty Nine Palms post office.


