d. Average Monthly Strength During the Period. 5 Air/Ground Officers, 104 Enlisted, 109 total.

2. Sequential Listing of Significant Events, Especially as they Relate to:

a. Personnel. One officer was transferred out of the unit. Ten Marines were awarded the Organized Marine Corps Reserve Medal.

b. Administration. The Detachment Administrative section has effectively maintained the unit's records, basic correspondence, SRB audits, and reports during the period.

c. Intelligence. Negative Report.

d. Training

(1) During the course of the 12 months covered by this report, priority has continued to be placed on maintaining qualification and expertise of Redeye Gunners. 134 hours have been devoted to Redeye Training. This training has consisted of aircraft recognition, tracking head training, map reading, communi-

cations and associated military training. The unit achieved a 50% completion rate for MCI courses, with a 94% passing rate on the PFT.

(2) Unit training accomplished during ATD is as follows:

(a) During 18 July - 1 August 1981, the unit participated in a RESPHIBLEX at MCAS Cherry Point, North Carolina. The unit performed Redeye training as well as training in and out of the classroom. Training consisted of THT, aircraft recognition, NBC, 8 mile force march, land navigation, and rifle range qualification. Three officers, 4 SNCO's, and 33 enlisted personnel participated.

(b) During 12 - 25 July 1981, the unit assigned 1 officer and 16 enlisted personnel to New River, North Carolina for Redeye training, RESPHIBLEX.

(c) During 14 - 26 July 1981, the assigned 5 enlisted personnel to Motor Transportation School at Camp LeJeune, North Carolina.

(d) During 7 - 20 June 1981, the unit assigned 1 officer and 10 enlisted personnel to the Redeye School at Fort Bliss, Texas.

e. Special Operations

(1) 9 - 11 October 1981, the unit deployed selected members to Onslow Beach, North Carolina. Training highlights consisted of firing a live Redeye and the familiarization of NBC gear.

(2) 2 - 3 May 1981, the unit deployed to Dahlonga, Georgia. The training consisted of THT, radio communication, and rappelling.

f. Command and Control. Negative report.

g. Logistics. General supply system, requisitioning, and record keeping was maintained. First echelon maintenance, OJT, and classes were conducted for the equipment organic to the detachment.

h. Air Defense. The complete spectrum of Redeye training was conducted as mentioned in previous paragraphs.
