PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During January, the Battalion deployed a Battery (-) to participate in the Cruise Missile Survivability Test Phase I at Nellis AFB, Nevada from 1 January to 8 January. Battery A was assigned the task of operating with MACS-23 and aid in the training of 4th LAAM Bn personnel. Select personnel from each unit within the Battalion were chosen to participate in cold weather training at Bridgeport, Ca. from 27 January to 7 February. LtCol HOLDER began his inspection of all Battalion personnel in Winter Service "A".

2. In February, Battery A concluded successful operations with MACS-23. On 10 February, Battery C provided a static HAWK display at the Battalion's Motor Transport compound for NROTC student visitors. During the week of 21 - 27 February all units within the Battalion were administered a practical EST test at the P-111 desert training site to fulfill a large number of training requirements for the calendar year. From 27 February to 3 March Battery C conducted an ORE near the Raven Butte area to evaluate its combat readiness.

3. In March, Col HOLMES, Commanding Officer of MACG-38, paid a visit to the Battalion. In an effort to provide the most complete training possible for the WTI students, the Battalion supplied Battery A to fulfill the requirements for an effective air defense unit during the WTI Final Examination from 13 - 22 March. On the 28th of March, Battery B deployed to 29 Palms to participate in exercise Palm Tree 5-78. Battery A and Battery C participated in an Anti-Air Warfare exercise with MCCRTG-10 on 30 and 31 March.

4. In April, the primary Battalion emphasis was placed on preparation for the up-coming HAWK fire exercise, STREAKER VIII, in which both Batteries A and B were scheduled to fire. While preparing for the STREAKER VIII exercise, major communication modifications were installed in major end items of the HAWK system. Modifications were completed on the 18th of April. On the 24th of April the Battalion conducted a PFT in which all available personnel participated. Of over 400 tested, the percentage of those passing the PFT was 97.5. Also during the month of April Lt. General BROWN, Major General Maloney, and the Sgt. Major of the Marine Corps visited the Battalion.

5. May proved to be a very busy and productive month begining with the highly successful fire exercise, STREAKER VIII, on 1 May - 8 May in which both Batteries A and B demonstrated their ability to fire in a totally automatic mode. Battery A also demonstrated the normal and manual mode capabilities. Immediately after returning from STREAKER VIII, Battery A was deployed to MCTSSA at Camp Pendleton from 11 May to 2 June to participate in the IDT testing program. From 9 to 11 May an administration inspection team from MACG-38 conducted an inspection of units within the Battalion. FSMAO teams conducted complete inspections in all applicable areas within the Battalion from 15 May to 19 May. Command of Battery C was transfered from 1stLt J.E. RYAN to Capt R.K. BARTZER on 12 May. Battery C conducted a FamFire of the 50 Cal. and M-60 machine guns, and combat tactics exercise in which NBC defense drills were incorporated on 12 May. Command of Battery B was transfered from Capt G.S. FICK to 1stLt R.J. DUHON on 24 May.

6. During the month of June there were no scheduled operations. The Battalion was inspected be MCDOSIT on 1 June, and by Administration and Maintenance inspectors on the 6th and 7th of June. The primary emphasis was placed on equipment maintenance with a total Battalion maintenance standown held from 14 to 23 June. Headquarters and Service Battery held a change of Command ceremony with Capt G.K. MANARY assuming command from Capt D.F. DZIEDZIC on 14 June.
