PART II

MARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During January Operation DUSTY II, a 2 battery helo lift, highlighted the month, with "A" and "C" Batteries participating as well as a Logistic Support Element from H&S Battery. DUSTY II provided a follow-up to DUSTY I held in December 1975, which was a one battery exercise, and significantly increased the Battalion's readiness in helo assault operations. Field Essential Subjects Training was conducted during DUSTY II, complete with an actual aircraft spray attack for NBC defense training. Daily Automated Maintenance System (DAMS) reporting began this month, with Engineers, Motor T, and Communications being the first to utilize the system within the Battalion. Bn S-1 and MMO conducted a directives distribution system revision conference for all commodity areas in H&S Battery. "B" Battery began preparing for upcoming cold-weather exercise, DONNER IV, at Bridgeport, CA, and "A" Battery field tested a Raytheon proposed intrabattery communications system using TA-312's. Visits this month included Maj. CARR, MCDEC, to conduct a Maintenance Allocation Planning Study, and Capt. FISHERO, MACG-38 to conduct DANS classes.

2. During February two exercises took place, DOWNER IV, a cold weather exercise, at Bridgeport, CA., in which "B" Battery participated, and a MABLEX at Camp Pendleton, CA. in which "C" Battery participated. Batteries A and C, Communications, Engineers, HAWK Maintenance, Supply, Motor T, and Maintenance Support Logistics were inspected for embarkation readiness, while a maintenance analysis of HAWK Maintenance, Comm, and "A" Battery was conducted during the month. Six officers received training on Mechanized Data System for Embarkation, while Supply, HAWK Maintenance and all 3 firing batteries commenced DAMS reporting. Visits included LtCol DAIZELL, 3RD MAW, Engineer Officer, LtCol RAINS, I.C.P. Philadelphia, for a general staff visit, and Maj TRENSKI, S-4, MACG-38.

3. During March FMFPAC held its biannual inspection of the Battalion. Results were satisfactory. "B" Battery was busy readying itself for Operation STREAMER III, as they began system integrated checks along with pre-fire checks. "A" Battery, Comm, the AAOC, Motor T, and Engineers participated in Operation CHECKMATE, a Marine Air Control Group Electronic Warfare exercise. A maintenance analysis of "C" Battery, and Engineers Section was conducted as well as a series of MIMPS classes for "B" Battery. The MMO section attended a Maintenance Management Seminar at El Toro, and Maj CAVAGMARO, 3RD MAM Embark Officer visited the Embark/S-4 section on the 25th.

4. During April the S-4/MMO section conducted a Maintenance Analysis of batteries B and C and Motor T. A noise survey was conducted around the Improved HAJK gear by the Station Safety Lanager which led to the ordering of ear protectors for personnel working on or around the HAJK equipment. The 3RD MAW inspected MAO during April, with Maj BROWN heading the inspecting party. "B" Battery remained active in anticipation of STREAKER ITI by conducting TCO, FCO, and TCA training during the month. To top off the month, the Battalion held a Carnival in support of the Mavy Relief drive.

5. During May all three firing batteries participated in exercises in various locations. "B" Battery had an excellent shoot (6 for 6) during Operation STREAKER III at Gila Bend, AZ. "C" Battery participated in a MODEC sponsored field test of the Meapons Director Unit (MDU), a device designed to provide electronic early warning for FAAD teams armed with either Redeve or Stinger. "C" Battery participation included use of the new IPCP in a modified AFU configuration as well as use of three of the Battalion's four FAAD teams. "A" Battery was away for two weeks on Operation PALMIREE IV at 29 Palms. During this operation "A" Battery made the first helo lift of an improved assault fire unit, featuring the IPCP recently tested by "C" Battery. The AFU was operationally ready within 1 hour after the last piece of equipment reached the assault site. This concept of operation allowed "A" Battery to provide continuous air defense coverage of the AOA while leap frogging its units. A FSMAO analysis was also held this month. A visit was made by Col MCCAMEY, MACG-38 Commander, who witnessed the FIREX at Gila Bend.

6. During June the battalion took the opportunity to re-group from its numerous committments and catch up on essential training. A safety stand-down was held on 18 June in which everyone within the battalion participated by attending various classes. The Communications Platoon scheduled and ran its own Commer at Ht. Laguna, California, to train in and test out various forms of long range voice and data transmissions.
