4. Civic Action

- a. Steps have been taken to set up a second clinic on Ky Hoa Island for NADCAP visits. The selected location is Hoa My Hamlet.
- b. A large box of assorted vegetable seeds was received by the battalion for distribution to the refugee farmers on Ky Hoa. In addition, the battalion was informed that four or five more boxes of seeds and farm tools are now enroute.

5. Additional Units

- a. A sentry dog platoon was attached to Battery "A" on 17 March, 1966.
