Part III. Significant Events.

1. Personnel.

a. Captain T.R. SNEAD, 093444 and First Lieutenant B.R. COURTNEY, 0100143 were promoted to their present rank during the month of January.

b. H&S Battery promoted five men to Lance Corporal and three men to Private First Class.

c. Battery A promoted two men to Lance Corporal.

d. Battery B promoted three men to Lance Corporal.

e. H&S Battery extended the enlistments of two men, one staff sergeant for six months and one sergeant for one year.

g. One member of Battery B died during the month of January. Corporal Peter FLETCHER, 2209116/5915 was killed when he fell from the rear of a truck on 20 January 1968. This accident occurred while traveling north on the road between H&S Battery and Battery B.

2. Civil Affairs.

a. During TET the CA Team distributed 1875 gifts throughout the village of Ky Hoa. The village chief, Mr. Hieu, supervised the distribution

to the hamlets. Also distributed by CA were 21,160 piastres. The money was passed out in TET envelopes containing 20 piastres apiece.

b. Progress on the wells at Hoa Trung (489141) and Hoa Long (501128) has stopped. The monsoon has forced CA to delay construction until the water table lowers.

c. The CA Team conducted a MEDCAP to Hoa Thanh Hamlet (Fish Island) (479125); CAP Kilo 1 provided security. Because of the island's relative isolation, V.C. are prone to use it as a rest area. Increased CA attention should assist in pacification of the island. One-hundred bags of cement have already been provided the hamlet. This cement will be used for construction of a new school.

d. LtCol HERMAN, Major BALDWIN, Lt. EMERY (USN) and members of CA Team attended several TET dinners on Ky Hoa island.

3. Motor Transportation. A total of 3,521 miles were driven in support of the Chu Lai Combat Base.

4. Education.
