2. PERSONNEL/ADMINISTRATION

The trend of decline in personnel figures established in January of 1972 has continued throughout the past six months as witnessed by a further decline in total enlisted numbers. Total enlisted strength in July was 475 and is now 464. Although Staff NCO numbers remained relatively stable from January through June, the past six months reveal a decline in these numbers. Only the Officer's numbers have remained stable through 1972.

- b. The figures presented do not include the Marine Wing Weapons Unit-3, which became Sub-Unit 1, H&S Battery, 2nd LAAMBn on Feb 1 1972.
- c. Legal-Disciplinary action in the past six months totalled 84 NJPs, 11 SCMs and 13 SPCMs. Two Bad Conduct Discharges have been awarded and subsequently suspended by the Convening Authority. Violation of Article 86 continues to be the predominate type of offense and Articles 90,91,92, and 134 were violated several times. Proceedings in Administrative Discharges resulted in 6 approved and 5 pending final action.
- d. The Battalion has a basic preventive law program in effect which all Batteries/Sections are presented with once a quarter.
- e. Personnel reporting continued at an acceptable rate with an average monthly error rate of 4% based on an average of 708 transactions per month

3. PERSONNEL PROGRAMS/PROCEDURE

a. Awards recleved during the past six months include eleven meritorious masts and four letters of appreciation/commendation. Thirty seven personnel were awarded superior performance pay effective on 1 July. One Marine received SDA-1, effective September 1.

b. Marines requested Mast with the Battalion Commanding Officer on nineteen occasions during the past six months. Only two of these requests were referred to higher command. The subjects of the requests were without trend and indicated no prevailing problem.

- c. No battalion personnel participated in the Drug Exemption Program during the past six months.
- d. There were sixty-four battalion personnel advanced in rank during the last six months. Five sergeants were advanced to Staff Rank. Six of the fifty-six promotions to sergeant and below were meritoriously awarded. Three officers were promoted to 1st Lieutenant.

4. CAREER PLANNING/EDUCATION

a. PERSONNEL STATUS

(1) At present there is one officer, 2 Staff NCOs and one sergeant assigned full time as Career Planners in this Unit. All the enlisted Career Planners are formal school trained with a minimum of one year experience in the Career Planning Billet.


